This hearing is part of a series of hearings to assess affordable and rental housing programs fifty years after the creation of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This hearing, in particular, will examine two reports that compare the affordable housing models of the United States and the United Kingdom. Both countries faced significant administrative costs in providing

affordable housing and experienced the need to implement innovative management practices while investing significant amounts of capital (including private capital) in housing programs. By outlining how the United Kingdom addressed these needs, the reports provide insight to policymakers charged with administering and improving affordable housing programs in the United States.
