## [DEFENSE PRODUCTION ACT REAUTHORIZATION] OFFERED BY Ms. WATERS OF CALIFORNIA

Add at the end of the bill the following:

1	SEC. 5. STATEMENT OF POLICY.
2	Section 2(b) of the Defense Production Act of 1950
3	(50 U.S.C. App. 2062(b)) is amended—
4	(1) in paragraph (7), by striking "and" at the
5	$\operatorname{end};$
6	(2) in paragraph (8), by striking the period and
7	inserting "; and; and
8	(3) by adding at the end the following:
9	"(9) to strengthen the economic and techno-
10	logical competitiveness of the U.S. defense indus-
11	trial base, it is critical to fully utilize and access the
12	talent pool available in this country, including by
13	promoting, to the maximum extent possible, the fair
14	inclusion and involvement of minorities, women, mi-
15	nority-owned businesses, women-owned businesses,
16	veteran-owned businesses, service-disabled veteran-
17	owned businesses, businesses that demonstrate the
18	inclusion of minorities, women, and veterans at all
19	levels of their business and activities, and small busi-

1	ness concerns, in the plans, programs, and contracts
2	necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act.".
3	SEC. 6. ANNUAL REPORT ON TITLE III CONTRACTING.
4	Title III of the Defense Production Act of 1950 (50
5	U.S.C. App. 2091 et seq.) is amended by adding at the
6	end the following:
7	"SEC. 305. ANNUAL REPORT ON CONTRACTING.
8	"(a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Each Federal department
9	or agency that utilizes authorities provided under this title
10	shall submit an annual report, no later than March 31st
11	of each year, to the Committee on Financial Services of
12	the House of Representatives and the Committee on
13	Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate, on
14	the extent to which contracts entered into during the pre-
15	vious fiscal year have been contracts with minority-owned
16	businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned busi-
17	ness, service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, and busi-
18	nesses that demonstrate the inclusion of minorities,
19	women, veterans, and service-disabled veterans at all levels
20	of their business and activities.
21	"(b) Contents of Report.—The report submitted
22	under subsection (a) shall include the following:
23	"(1) The types of goods and services obtained
24	under contracts with minority-owned businesses,

women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses,

1	service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, and with
2	businesses that demonstrate the inclusion of minori-
3	ties, women, veterans, and service-disabled veterans
4	at all levels of their business and activities under
5	this Act in the fiscal year covered in the report.
6	"(2) The dollar amount, and percentage of total
7	dollar amounts, of such contracts awarded under
8	this Act in the fiscal year covered in the report by
9	such Federal department or agency to minority-
10	owned businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-
11	owned businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned
12	businesses, and businesses that demonstrate the in-
13	clusion of minorities, women, veterans, and service-
14	disabled veterans at all levels of their business and
15	activities.
16	"(3) The race, ethnicity, gender, and veteran
17	status of the majority owners of such businesses.
18	"(4) A summary of how, with respect to each
19	such contract, the company receiving such contract
20	has demonstrated the inclusion of minorities
21	women, veterans, and service-disabled veterans at al
22	levels of the company's business and activities.".
23	SEC. 7. MODERNIZATION OF SUPPLIERS.
24	Section 701 of the Defense Production Act of 1950
25	(50 U.S.C. App. 2151) is amended—

1	(1) by amending the heading of such section to
2	read as follows: "SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPA-
3	TION AND FAIR INCLUSION";
4	(2) in subsection (a), by inserting after "Small
5	business concerns" the following: ", minority-owned
6	businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned
7	businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned busi-
8	nesses, and businesses that demonstrate the inclu-
9	sion of minorities, women, veterans, and service-dis-
10	abled veterans at all levels of their business and ac-
11	tivities";
12	(3) in subsection (b), by inserting after "small
13	business concerns" the following: ", minority-owned
14	businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned
15	businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned busi-
16	nesses, and businesses that demonstrate the inclu-
17	sion of minorities, women, veterans, and service-dis-
18	abled veterans at all levels of their business and ac-
19	tivities";
20	(4) in subsection (c), by inserting after "small
21	business concerns" the following: ", minority-owned
22	businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned
23	businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned busi-
24	nesses, and businesses that demonstrate the inclu-
25	sion of minorities, women, veterans, and service-dis-

1	abled veterans at all levels of their business and ac-
2	tivities";
3	(5) in subsection (d)—
4	(A) by inserting after "with this Act" the
5	following: "and outreach and technical assist-
6	ance"; and
7	(B) by inserting after "small business con-
8	cerns" the following: ", minority-owned busi-
9	nesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned
10	businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned busi-
11	nesses, and businesses that demonstrate the in-
12	clusion of minorities, women, veterans, and
13	service-disabled veterans at all levels of their
14	business and activities"; and
15	(6) by adding at the end the following:
16	"(f) GOOD FAITH EFFORT.—Each Federal depart-
17	ment and agency shall develop procedures for reviewing
18	and evaluating contract proposals made pursuant to this
19	Act that include, to the extent consistent with the provi-
20	sion under which such proposal is being made, a compo-
21	nent that gives consideration to the diversity of the appli-
22	cant. Such procedures shall include a written statement,
23	in such form and with such content as the head of the
24	department or agency prescribes, that a contractor shall
25	ensure to the maximum extent possible the fair inclusion

1	of minorities, women, veterans, and service-disabled vet-
2	erans in the workforce of the contractor and, as applicable,
3	subcontractors or suppliers.".
4	SEC. 8. DEFINITIONS.
5	Section 702 of the Defense Production Act of 1950
6	(50 U.S.C. App. 2152) is amended by adding at the end
7	the following:
8	"(18) MINORITY.—The term 'minority' has the
9	meaning given such term in section 1204(c)(3) of
10	the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and
11	Enforcement Act of 1989.
12	"(19) MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESS.—The term
13	'minority-owned business' means a business-
14	"(A) more than 50 percent of the owner-
15	ship or control of which is held by 1 or more
16	minority individuals; and
17	"(B) more than 50 percent of the net prof-
18	it or loss of which accrues to 1 or more minor-
19	ity individuals.
20	"(20) Service-disabled veteran.—The term
21	'service-disabled veteran' means a veteran with a
22	disability that is service-connected (as defined in sec-
23	tion 101(16) of title 38, United States Code).

1	"(21) Service-disabled veteran-owned
2	BUSINESS.—The term 'service-disabled veteran-
3	owned business' means a business—
4	"(A) more than 50 percent of the owner-
5	ship or control of which is held by 1 or more
6	service-disabled veterans; and
7	"(B) more than 50 percent of the net prof-
8	it or loss of which accrues to 1 or more service-
9	disabled veterans.
10	"(22) VETERAN.—The term 'veteran' has the
11	meaning given the term in section 101(2) of title 38,
12	United States Code.
13	"(23) Veteran-owned business.—The term
14	'veteran-owned business' means a business—
15	"(A) more than 50 percent of the owner-
16	ship or control of which is held by 1 or more
17	veterans; and
18	"(B) more than 50 percent of the net prof-
19	it or loss of which accrues to 1 or more vet-
20	erans.
21	"(24) Women-owned business.—The term
22	'women-owned business' means a business—
23	"(A) more than 50 percent of the owner-
24	ship or control of which is held by 1 or more
25	women;

1	"(B) more than 50 percent of the net prof-
2	it or loss of which accrues to 1 or more women;
3	and
4	"(C) a significant percentage of senior
5	management positions of which are held by
6	women.".
