## Internship Program

The Committee on Financial Services offers a limited number of internships to undergraduate and graduate students. Interns are provided a unique opportunity to be involved first hand with the workings of an especially demanding congressional Committee and the legislative process. The Committee on Financial Services is the second largest committee in Congress. The Committee oversees the entire financial services industry, as well as the Federal Reserve, all financial services regulators including the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), and the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Based on your interests you will be placed with one of the Committee's staff teams and work closely with the staff on a variety of tasks. You will assist staff in the preparation of hearings, writing summaries of legislation, and researching current issues before the Committee.

Internships are offered throughout the year. Please keep in mind that summer is a very popular time and we only have a limited number of spaces available. The deadline for summer internships is March 15. These internships are unpaid, but may be applied toward college credits. If you are interested in an internship with the Committee, please send

- a writing sample,
- an essay of 500 words or less about why you would like to internship with the Committee, and
